TWC Rules Chapter 800.68 provides that TWC set performance accountability benchmarks that AEL grant recipients must meet in order to access up to 10% of their allocated funding. We refer to this as the performance-based holdback. The program year 2020 performance-based holdback, as approved by the Commission back in June, is 2% of an AEL grantees' overall allocation.

The following is a brief description of the items outlined under issue 1 of your notebook material. Issue 2 outlines items which will be taken to the Commission at a future date. Last October, the Commission approved the performance-based funding criteria, which incorporated measures under House Bill 1949, as passed in the 86th legislature regular session. The Commission also approved the holdback for this measure at that time, which was 33.33% of a grantees' allocation for this current program year. So, this is described in your notebook materials as measure 1.

Measure 2 criteria relates to a student retention and measure scale gained criteria and AEL grantees which meet this measure are able to access the remaining 66.66% of that performance-based holdback this current program year. Attachment 1 of your notebook materials show the amounts for both measure 1 and measure 2.

2 the criteria found in House Bill 1949, so next program year's, 3 Program Year 2021, this will be known as measure 1. 4 So, at this time, staff seeks direction on 5 the following items: first, to rescind program year 20s measure 6 1 to release that 33.33% of the program year 20 performancebased allocation to grant recipients. Second, to assigning the 8 performance-based criteria described in measure 2, giving grant recipients access to approximately 66.66% of the remaining 10 program year 20 performance-based allocation. And, third and 11 last, to assign that criteria to continue the implementation of 12 House Bill 1949 in program year 2021, so this will be program 13 year 2021 measure 1. That's all I have, and I'm happy to answer 14 any questions you might have. 15 16 Comments or questions?
